Guests of the Eco-Heal Home include individuals seeking refuge from renovations or pesticide usage. Strict rules apply while staying at the retreat. Smoking is not allowed, and visitors are expected not to bring perfumed products such as lotions, sprays, laundry detergents, deodorisers, incense, or other potentially toxic products like cleaning agents and pesticides. The Retreat supplies safe alternatives; as well, it is heated with electric baseboard. Double-pane windows; unscented laundry machines; glass doors in shower. Although its environment is hazardous-chemical free, the Eco-Heal Home is far from rustic; it boasts amenities such as three computer workstation areas with high-speed Internet access. Back-to-basics practices combined with a few high-tech trimmings yield a nicely balanced environment.

Organic food available. Some pot-pourri and flowers and plants in rooms, but can be removed upon request. Bedroom windows can open. They face a busy road, but the breeze usually comes from the opposite direction, from the lake and across farmer's fields. No pesticides used in the house or the yard. No fireplaces inside the house. Open firepit in yard. House is approximately 130 years old. No air conditioning. In summer, open windows and portable fans cool the house. Low levels of electromagnetic fields. Wood panelling in bedroom is solid wood. Host is willing to go to some effort to accommodate those with multiple chemical sensitivities.

Chairs, couches, tables - even the window blinds - are made of natural woods. Carpeting and blankets are 100 percent organic wool, while wall

treatments, mattresses, pillows, and linens are 100 percent organic cotton.

Organic vegetable-based soaps, shampoos and conditioners are found in every room. Four of the rooms feature composting toilets which use no water,

produce no odours and require no chemical treatments. Even the paint, sparingly used, is a special low-gas emission formula. Guests with allergies

and chemical sensitivities will love this place.

Details: The Barrhaven Non Profit Housing Co op owns and operates a private non-profit housing project on land adjacent to, and leased from the Barrhaven United Church, operating at "arms length" from the church. The residential housing project includes 41 units, a number of which include features designed for tenants with physical challenges. A unique aspect of the project is a building with seven units custom-designed, with specialised expertise provided by CMHC, for persons suffering from environmental hypersensitivities (ES). Long waiting list. Advantages: The environmentally-safe building was built and finished with environmentally-safe materials. Disadvantages: Non-sustaining walls as well as some ceilings are basswood, which off gases terpenes (the wood is not well sealed); some people cannot tolerate it. Most tenants in other buildings use fabric softener in their dryer, which can be felt and smelt in the air on the property. Many neighbours use pesticides on their lawns from May to Sept. The Co-op is surrounded by farms using pesticides from the beginning of May (mostly) to Sept. inclusively. In conclusion: While not perfect, this environmentally-designed building can offer a safe haven.

Details: Rental housing co-op, environmentally-friendly (was first occupied in 1995, so there wouldn't be any off-gassing anymore. Some of the tenants have environmental sensitivities. Management and tenants use environmentally-friendly products. HRV system in building. Low VOC paint and products used when renovating units). Individuals must check the building and the units to see if suitable.

Caution: Smoking is allowed within individual units and this may make the entire building unsuitable for a person with MCS to enter depending on individual sensitivities. Also, though the building is environmentally-friendly, the cleaning products are citrus-based; they probably have a scent. Suggestion: Wear a protective mask that one can tolerate in the common areas until inside one's own unit.

Website. Not much perfume worn in the place but no scent-free policy. Cleaning products are regular industrial products, and cleaning is done daily. Suggestions: Bring your own towels and bedding, including mattress protector; put all residence towels, soap and bedding, including mattress protector, bedspread, pillows and book regarding the Residence (on the desk), in garbage bags, which are then sealed and put in the closet. Replace with your own bedding, towels, soap, etc. Air the room. Ahead of time, cook and freeze enough meat for the duration of your stay as well as for the travel there and back. Bring enough cleaned vegetables and other desired foods, or buy these in Montréal (grocery store on St. Laurent Street, to the right of Pine Avenue, and health food store on the same street, to the left of Pine Ave.). Keep meat frozen during the trip. Store everything in the fridge at the residence. Once at the residence, ask that the cleaning staff not clean your room during your stay, to avoid being exposed to chemical cleaning products. Of course, if you are there for one night only and out the next morning, this does not apply.

All paints and varnishes to be used must be VOC (Volatile Organic Compound) free or low VOC. Cleaning materials chosen for their suitability. Rugs: Washable. Depending on the location, the house can either have solar panels, a geothermal, or a wind generator system, or a hybrid system. The exterior walls are made of maintenance-free Cor-Ten steel, Galvalume, Hardi panels or cedar planks to blend in with the context.
